Your organisation must be based in England			
You must hold one of these registrations in order to apply for this grant:	Be registered as a 'not for profit' organisation in England

You must have both an up to date adult and child safeguarding policy in place			
Your project must empower and reach children whose schools or youth organisations are situated in less advantaged socio-economic areas of England [as determined by the UK National deprivation data base and access to free school meals database].			
Your project must work with children aged between 5 – 14 years old in England			
Your project must work in a care home for older people (This excludes Sheltered schemes, extra care schemes, retirement schemes and supported living).			
<p><u>This project requires mandatory participation in Co-Inquiry practices</u></p> <p>Becoming a Co-inquirer in this project means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sharing your approaches to intergenerational linking with care homes and the nature of their evaluation • Use your own expertise to co-create with the project team new ways of working that are mutually beneficial for young and older people • Sharing your Ideas, resources, templates, and materials generated within this project, so that they can be freely shared with others • Reflect and sharing your project learning (What working well and why? How would we like things to be? How can we work together to make it happen? You must be able to sustain an 18x month intergenerational project with this grant. The 18 months incorporates a 6 month planning and preparation period and a 12 month period of activity.			
You must embed and work throughout your 18 month project to <u>the 6 key #iwill principles</u> as set out by The National Lottery's Community Fund - (be challenging, be youth led, be socially impactful, be progressive, be embedded, and be reflective.
